

Eric is now working as a chef at a Framingham hotel and will begin working with an ESL tutor at the Morse Library shortly. Tiffany graduated from a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course at Mass Bay this summer and has begun a job as a Program Assistant at a healthcare center. Once she passes the CNA licensing exam in late September she will transition into a CNA

position there. Their son is in kindergarten and their daughter, who is three, began Head Start last week. Their one-year-old daughter will continue at her day care in Framingham. Eric has also earned his driver's license since arriving at FPM, and the family has just received a car. As soon as Tiffany passes her CNA exam, she will begin studying for her permit test with the goal of getting her driver's license also.

Mona and her two sons have also become settled into their new routine. Mona has returned to full-time CNA work now that her boys are back in school. She will also begin working with an ESL tutor at the Morse Library and is looking forward to starting a GED program once her English skills have developed further. The boys have both joined local soccer teams and had their first games this fall.



FOUNDATION FOR METROWEST

Family Promise Metrowest continues to be grateful for the support we receive from the Foundation for Metrowest. The following article was highlighted in the August edition of the Foundation for Metrowest newsletter.

Grantee Highlight

Family Promise MetroWest received a grant from the Foundation in 2015 to help start a new program, Steps to Success, which aims to "offer a comprehensive approach to employment including education and resources that encourage families to reach their highest earning potential."

Throughout the course of the first Steps to Success program, 79% of families served by Family Promise MetroWest took a new class or training program to help improve their career skills and earning potential. Not only did participants undertake training, but 80% of teens in the program signed up for summer "career exploration" camp or for summer jobs. The success of this program is measured not only through the data gathered by the number of training sessions attended, but also by the growing confidence and motivation the families feel as they "work their way back into sustainable incomes and, ultimately, homes," according to the organization's executive director, Sue Crossley.



We would also like to express our gratitude to Middlesex Savings Bank for their generous grant of \$15,000 to support our Steps to Success program. This program has been essential in supporting our families in reaching long term sustainability and independence.

We celebrate Janet King, a Family Promise Metrowest volunteer from Wellesley, who has been serving at our Day Center on weekends every month for the past three years. She is dedicated to our program and devoted to our families. The children always enjoy her creative craft projects.

This summer, Janet's focus was to encourage families in shelters to vote in November's Election. She followed her passion and reached out to shelters not only in this state, but all over the country, connecting with Family Promise National as well.

Thank you, Janet, for initiating this project and for your ongoing commitment to making a difference for the families we serve and for others across the nation.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

This past year, FPM entered a partnership with the Natick Affordable Housing Trust to create affordable housing in Natick, and we are thrilled with the progress of the home being built!



With help from a \$30,000 grant from the Wellesley Congregational Church and labor from Keefe Tech students, the home is progressing beautifully. The two-family house, which will include a two-bedroom and three-bedroom unit, will be






